Applying to U of T

Applying to U of T is a straightforward process.
You'll find more information within this bulletin.

Submit your application

September - January

Start your application in late September 2026 and submit it by **November 7, 2026** to be considered in the earliest rounds of admission. The final application deadline is January 15, 2027.

Complete next steps

October - March

Check your email for a link to activate your JOINid and access the application portal. **Submit any required documents and complete next steps** before the listed deadlines.

Submit your residence application by **March 31, 2027**, even if you haven't received an admission decision yet.

If you are not a Canadian citizen or permanent resident, you must **obtain a valid study permit before entering Canada**. You may also need to submit a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) as part of the study permit application.

How to Apply

Applicants wishing to be considered for admission to several Ontario universities should apply to the University of Toronto through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).

Applicants who are interested in applying only to the University of Toronto, who reside outside of Canada, and who are neither currently studying nor have previously studied in Canada may apply using the University of Toronto International Application.

Application Deadlines

Submitting a complete application as early as possible allows your application to be considered earlier. After the application deadline has passed, programs that are not full may consider applicants on a rolling basis. Once we receive your application, we will send you an email acknowledgement with next steps.

Document Deadlines

Applicants who submit required documents early can maximize their opportunities for admission consideration.

If you applied by our early consideration application date, plan to submit any required documents that are available to you by December 1. The document deadline date for most program areas is February 1; Applied Science & Engineering has a January 15 deadline. We strongly encourage you to submit all required documents well in advance of the deadlines.

Supplemental Applications

Some programs, colleges and campuses ask students to fill out a supplemental application or profile. You will be notified if you need to fill out a supplemental application or profile, as well as where to submit and when.

After Applying

About a week after you submit your application, you will get an email acknowledging that we have received your application. The email will also ask you to activate a set of personal login credentials (JOINid) and then sign into the **Join U of T Applicant Portal** or the **Engineering Applicant Portal**. This will unlock the second step of the application process.

Join U of T is a one-stop applicant dashboard that lists everything we need from you and your next steps. It is the first place you should go if you want to check the status of your application, and it's the best place to go if you are not sure what to do next. When you log in, you'll be able to see if you need to provide any additional information and access our online residence application.

Engineering applicants will be redirected to a separate portal after signing into Join U of T, called the Engineering Applicant Portal, where you'll be able to complete the rest of your application. Be sure to submit any required documents by the deadlines listed in your portal.

Studying in Canada

Study Permit

International students planning to study in Canada generally require a valid study permit. A study permit is a document issued by the Canadian government that allows you to be in Canada and to study. It may also allow you to work on and/or off campus as long as you meet the requirements. More information and resources can be found at:

Provincial Attestation Letter

International students may need a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) for their study permit application. This letter confirms your acceptance and eligibility to study in Ontario. The PAL is provided to students after they complete key steps, including accepting an offer of admission and paying the admission deposit.

Guardianship

If you are an international student under the age of 18, you may be asked by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada to find a Canadian citizen to act as a guardian. Your family is responsible for satisfying this requirement.

Admission Requirements

Minimum admission requirements vary by educational jurisdiction and program of study. All applicants are required to present a Senior Year/Grade 12 English course for admission consideration. Mathematics (including Calculus) is required for programs with Mathematics prerequisites. All programs have limited spaces and selection is competitive. Some programs require a supplemental application. More information is available at:

University Transfer Applicants

Admission consideration is based on the overall academic record, with an emphasis on the most recent (or highest) level of study completed, and results in prerequisite subjects. Prerequisites must be completed at the Senior Year/Grade 12 level or at the undergraduate level.

Note that some programs do not consider applications from students who have previously attended a postsecondary institution. Be sure the program in which you are interested will consider your application.

Applicants who already hold a bachelor’s degree from a recognized postsecondary institution can only apply to a different field of study. Individuals who already hold an undergraduate degree in engineering are not eligible to apply for undergraduate studies at U of T Engineering.

Students who wish to take courses at the University of Toronto for credit toward a degree at another university should contact the target campus/faculty directly. Such students must present a valid Letter of Permission from their home university.

Program Areas

We offer flexibility when it comes to your program choices. You can apply to up to three different faculties or campuses in one application cycle, but only one application per area (for example, only one application to the Faculty of Arts & Science at the St. George campus).

Your applications will be considered independently from each other. That means you can receive multiple offers of admission and that your decisions may come at different times in the application cycle.

Example Scenarios

Scenario #1

You could apply once to the Faculty of Music, the Faculty of Kinesiology & Physical Education, and the Faculty of Arts & Science.

Scenario #2

You cannot apply to two program areas within the Faculty of Arts & Science.

Scenario #3

You could apply once to U of T Mississauga, U of T Scarborough, and the Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering (St. George campus).

Scenario #4

You cannot apply to two program areas at U of T Mississauga.

Transfer Credit

High School

Transfer credit towards arts, science and commerce/management programs is considered for some academic AP, IB, A Level, CAPE and French Baccalaureate subjects. Learn more:

English Language Requirements

Proof of adequate English facility is required from all applicants except for those:

- whose first language (i.e., the language learned at home as a child) is English; or
- who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in an English language school system located in a country where the dominant language is English; or
- whose first language is French and who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in Canada.

Tests and Qualifications That Provide Acceptable Evidence of English Facility

Academic English Course, School of Continuing Studies, University of Toronto

The minimum requirement is completion of Academic English Level 60 with grade of 'B.' uoft.me/academic-english-program

Duolingo English Test

The minimum requirement is an overall score of 120 with at least 120 in Production.

GCE A/AS Level English

The minimum requirement is English or English Language with grade of 'C.'

GCSE/IGCSE/GCE O Level English

The minimum requirement is English or English Language or English as a Second Language with a final grade of 'B' (or '6' in reformed qualifications).

International Baccalaureate English

The minimum requirement is Higher Level or Standard Level English A: Literature or English A: Language and Literature with a score of 4 (predicted or final). English B HL with a score of 7 (predicted/final) is also accepted.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic

The minimum requirement is an overall band of 6.5 with no band lower than 6.0.

Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic

The minimum requirement is an overall score of 65 with no part below 60.

TOEFL iBT

The minimum requirement is an overall score of 4.5 with 4.5 in Writing and 4.0 in Speaking. For applicants who completed the test before January 21, 2026, the minimum requirement is a total score of 89 with 22 in each of Speaking and Writing.

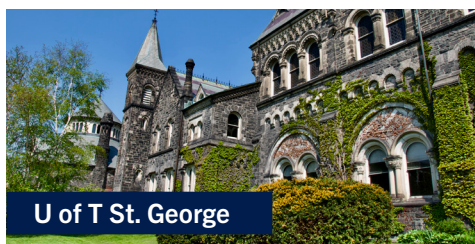

Working in Canada

International students are permitted to work part-time and may be able to incorporate paid work terms into their academic programs. After you graduate, you may be allowed to work in Canada, full-time, for up to three years.
