How to Apply

Applicants wishing to be considered for admission to several Ontario universities should apply to the University of Toronto through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).

Applicants who are interested in applying only to the University of Toronto, who reside outside of Canada, and who are neither currently studying nor have previously studied in Canada may apply using the University of Toronto International Application.

Application Deadlines

Submitting a complete application as early as possible allows your application to be considered earlier. After the application deadline has passed, programs that are not full may consider applicants on a rolling basis. Once we receive your application, we will send you an email acknowledgement with next steps.

Supplemental Applications

Some programs, colleges and campuses ask students to fill out a supplemental application or profile. You will be notified if you need to fill out a supplemental application or profile, as well as where to submit and when.

After Applying

About a week after you submit your application, you will get an email acknowledging that we have received your application. The email will also ask you to activate a set of personal login credentials (UTORid) and then sign into the **Join U of T Applicant Portal** or the **Engineering Applicant Portal**. This will unlock the second step of the application process.

Join U of T is a one-stop applicant dashboard that lists everything we need from you and your next steps. It is the first place you should go if you want to check the status of your application, and it's the best place to go if you are not sure what to do next. When you log in, you'll be able to see if you need to provide any additional information and access our online residence application.

Engineering applicants will be redirected to a separate portal after signing into Join U of T, called the Engineering Applicant Portal, where you'll be able to complete the rest of your application. Be sure to submit any required documents by the deadlines listed in your portal.

Studying in Canada

Student Permit

International students planning to study in Canada generally require a valid study permit. A study permit is a document issued by the Canadian government that allows you to be in Canada and to study. It may also allow you to work on and/or off-campus as long as you meet the requirements.

Provincial Attestation Letter

International students may need a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) for their study permit application. This letter confirms your acceptance and eligibility to study in Ontario. The PAL is provided to students after they complete key steps, including accepting an offer of admission and paying the admission deposit.

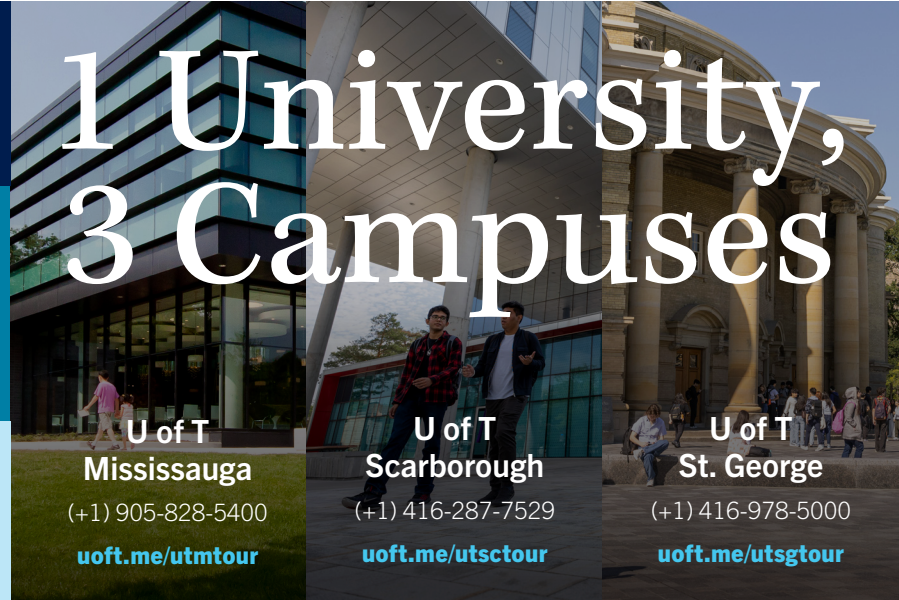

Admission Requirements

Minimum admission requirements vary by educational jurisdiction and program of study. All applicants are required to present a Senior Year/Grade 12 English course for admission consideration. Mathematics (including Calculus) is required for programs with Mathematics prerequisites. All programs have limited spaces and selection is competitive. Some programs require a supplemental application. More information is available at:

University Transfer Applicants

Admission consideration is based on the overall academic record, with an emphasis on the most recent (or highest) level of study completed, and results in prerequisite subjects. Prerequisites must be completed at the Senior Year/Grade 12 level or at the undergraduate level.

Note that some programs do not consider applications from students who have previously attended a postsecondary institution. Be sure the program in which you are interested will consider your application.

Applicants who already hold a bachelor's degree from a recognized postsecondary institution can only apply to a different field of study. Individuals who already hold an undergraduate degree in Engineering are not eligible to apply for undergraduate studies at U of T Engineering.

Students who wish to take courses at the University of Toronto for credit toward a degree at another university should contact the target campus/faculty directly. Such students must present a valid Letter of Permission from their home university.

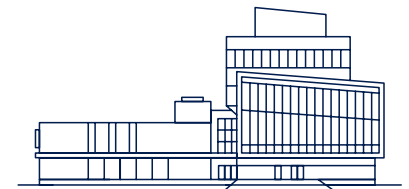
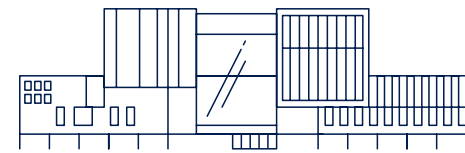

English Language Requirements

Proof of adequate English facility is required from all applicants except for those:

- whose first language (i.e., the language learned at home as a child) is English; or
- who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in an English language school system located in a country where the dominant language is English; or
- whose first language is French and who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in Canada.

Tests and Qualifications That Provide Acceptable Evidence of English Facility

Academic English Course, School of Continuing Studies, University of Toronto

The minimum requirement is completion of Academic English Level 60 with grade of ‘B’. uoft.me/academic-english-program

Duolingo English Test

The minimum requirement is an overall score of 120 with at least 120 in Production. Requirements for tests completed before July 1, 2024 and additional details are available on our website: uoft.me/elr

GCE A/AS Level English

The minimum requirement is English or English Language with grade of ‘C.’

GCSE/IGCSE/GCE O Level English

The minimum requirement is English or English Language or English as a Second Language with a final grade of ‘B’ (or ‘6’ in reformed qualifications).

International Baccalaureate English

The minimum requirement is Higher Level or Standard Level English A: Literature or English A: Language and Literature with a score of 4 (predicted or final). English B HL with a score of 7 (predicted/final) is also accepted.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic

The minimum requirement is an overall band of 6.5 with no band lower than 6.0.

Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic

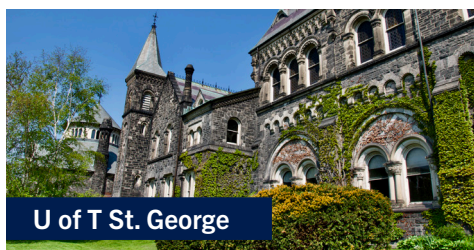
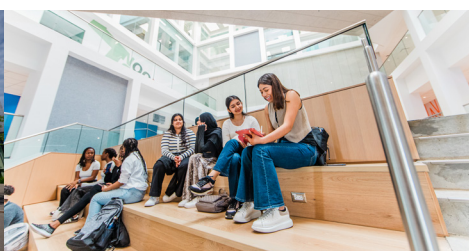
The minimum requirement is an overall score of 65 with no part below 60.

TOEFL iBT

The minimum requirement is a total score of 89 with 22 in each of Speaking and Writing. Applicants completing a test on January 21, 2026 or later should consult our website for updated score requirements: uoft.me/elr

Working in Canada

International students are permitted to work part-time and may be able to incorporate paid work terms into their academic programs. After you graduate, you may be allowed to live and work in Canada, full-time, for up to three years.

Housing & Residence Options

Housing is guaranteed for all new full-time students entering their first year of a postsecondary program for the first time, provided that they have indicated their interest in residence by completing the First Year StarRez application by **March 31**, and receive and accept an offer of admission by **June 1**. Students must respond to all deadlines and meet all deposit requirements in order to maintain their eligibility.

Admission Consideration

The admission selection process is based on your complete academic record, including results in prerequisite subjects, plus requested supplementary or profile information. Admission is competitive and subject to space availability. We seek to admit the best possible students on the basis of academic performance and potential, and will select students for admission based on competitive strength. Applicants to Theatre & Drama Studies must book an audition, which is weighted equally with your academic average.

Applicants to the Computer Science admission category must complete a Supplemental Application Form.

Applicants to the Computer Science and Rotman Commerce admission categories must complete a Supplemental Application. Faculty of Applied Science & Engineering

All applicants are required to submit an Online Student Profile. The Admissions Committee considers a candidate's overall academic history with emphasis on the prerequisite course average, along with the information provided on the Online Student Profile. Applicants must present grades of 70% or higher (typically higher) in individual prerequisite courses.

John H. Daniels Faculty of Architecture, Landscape, and Design

All applicants are required to complete the One Idea Supplementary Application: uoft.me/oneidea. The deadline for the One Idea Supplementary Application is February 1, 2026. Note: both professions of Architecture and Landscape Architecture require a graduate degree at the master's level.

Faculty of Music

An audition/interview is required for all music programs. The Admissions Committee considers a candidate's musical abilities, background, potential, and other applicable portfolio submissions, in conjunction with their overall academic history, with emphasis on the prerequisite English course mark.

Applicants must submit a Music Questionnaire by January 15 to arrange an audition/interview. The Music Questionnaire will be available on the Join U of T portal once you have applied through the OUAC. We recommend applying to the OUAC by December 1 to ensure you have sufficient time to access and complete the Music Questionnaire. Faculty of Kinesiology and Physical Education

All applicants must complete an online Statement of Interest form by February 2, 2026. Students planning to take upper-year biology courses in university should take Grade 12 Chemistry. Students who wish to add a minor or major in Psychology or Physics to their BKin degree should take Grade 12 Calculus. Learn more: kinesiology.utoronto.ca

Mixing Programs

When building an Arts, Science, or Business degree on your chosen campus, you can mix and match Specialist (9-16 credits), Major (6-9 credits), and Minor (4-5 credits) programs to suit your goals. For example, you can pursue a Specialist, or two Majors, or one Major and two Minors. Overall, in your undergraduate degree, you may take at least 20 credits across your chosen subject areas.
