I've been at SickKids research institute for the past two years working on exploring ion channels implicated in childhood brain cancers. We found an ion channel that's associated with medulloblastoma (the most common malignant childhood brain tumor) and when we remove it, survival increases and the tumour size decreases. Specifically, we think it's associated with cancer stem cells, which give rise to the bulk of the tumor, which could serve as a new cancer therapy target. This was super interesting to me because I came to university wanting to study stem cells (after being sold from a StemCellTalks Toronto event I went to at U of T when I was in high school). Cancer stem cells are something I never learned about in classes so it's been amazing learning about an entirely new field, within an area I've always been interested in.



Students can work towards a **Global Scholar** designation by taking a curated set of courses offered by their program or faculty. When those courses are completed, students will receive a certificate and a "Global Scholar" notation on their transcript. Students can also work towards a **Global Citizen** designation that can appear on their co-curricular record (CCR) through activities that develop three competencies: global perspective and engagement, inclusivity and equity, and community and civic engagement. A new **Minor in Global Leadership** is proposed to launch in 2022.

Engineering applicants will be redirected to a separate portal after signing into JOIN, called the Engineering Online Student Portal. Submit any required documents by the deadlines listed in your portal.

- Transcripts should be sent electronically through Parchment/Naviance/SCOIR. If your school doesn't use one of these services, upload your transcripts through JOIN or the Engineering Online Student Portal.
- If you are completing the IB curriculum, final IB results must be sent to the University electronically by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO).
- Students completing a U.S.-patterned high school curriculum should note that test-optional assessment has been adopted for the 2022-23 admissions cycle. For full details, including minimum requirements, consult the bulletin at the back of this book or visit uoft.me/UnitedStates.

Are applicants required to submit personal essays, reference letters, or portfolios?

If your program requires supplemental materials, this will be noted in your JOIN portal at **join.utoronto.ca** (or in your Engineering Applicant Portal). While some programs require supplemental applications or profiles—see p. 51—most of our programs do not.

Please note that essays and letters of reference will not be considered unless we specifically request them. Should supplemental materials be required for one of your target programs, you'll be notified after you've submitted your application.

Can international students live in residence?

On all three of our campuses, residence is guaranteed for new full-time students entering their first year of a postsecondary program for the first time, provided that they indicate their interest in residence by completing the First Year StarRez application by **March 31**, and receive and accept an offer of admission by **June 1**.

Students must respond to all deadlines and meet all deposit requirements to maintain their eligibility. Learn more at **residence.utoronto.ca**

I'm completing high school abroad, but I am a Canadian citizen. Will I pay international or domestic tuition fees?

Canadian Citizens, Landed Immigrants, and Permanent Residents are eligible to pay domestic tuition fees regardless of where they happen to be living when they apply to U of T. However, be aware that admission consideration is always based on the regional high school curriculum that you're completing.

What is U of T's acceptance rate?

Each of our academic divisions varies substantially in both size and application volumes, and so we don't have a defined acceptance rate. In addition, some specialized programs attract more interest and are consequently more competitive, and these programs admit fewer students due to space limitations.

Are there scholarships and financial aid programs for international students?

Check with your home country's ministry of education and student financial aid programs to see if you qualify for assistance. All applicants to U of T, including international applicants, are automatically considered for merit-based entrance scholarships. Learn more at **future.utoronto.ca/finances/scholarships**

Accept your offer—and keep your grades up. Find instructions on how to accept your offer of admission on the JOIN portal.



Pay your non-refundable admission deposit when you accept your offer of admission. For instructions on how to pay your deposit, go to your JOIN portal.



Apply for a study permit. Required documents may include, but may not be limited to, your official offer of admission to a university, evidence of adequate funds, and proof of medical clearance.



Maintain your residence guarantee by completing your first-year residence application on StarRez before March 31. Your residence office will contact you with your residence placement and deposit payment instructions.



Check your email regularly during the summer. Your Registrar and residence will send you essential next steps by email. Starting in July, you'll also be prompted to log into ACORN for your course enrolment start time. At that point, you can begin enrolling in courses. Note that first-year Engineering students do not choose courses and will be provided, instead, with a readymade schedule.



Your first tuition fee installment will be due in August. Each student will receive an invoice during the summer, tailored to their program. If you'll be living in residence, monitor your email regularly for updates from your Dean of Residence. And learn all about orientation week, sometimes known as Frosh Week, at hello.utoronto.ca



Applicants wishing to be considered for admission to several Ontario universities should apply to the University of Toronto through the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) using the "105" application.

Applicants who are interested in applying only to the University of Toronto, who reside outside of Canada, and who are neither currently studying nor have previously studied in Canada may apply using the "University of Toronto International application."

The University of Toronto does not deal with agents and it does not recommend that applicants deal with agents.

We encourage you to apply well in advance of published deadlines. Spaces fill quickly and programs may close before the application deadlines listed below. For complete details: future.utoronto.ca/apply/applying

DOCUMENT DEADLINES

Document deadlines vary by division. For a complete list of document deadlines, visit **future.utoronto.ca/apply**. We encourage applicants to submit all required documents well in advance of posted deadlines. Once we receive your application, we will send you an email acknowledgement with next steps.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants who have attained a high level of academic achievement and who completely satisfy prerequisites will be considered for admission. Minimum admission requirements vary by educational jurisdiction and program of study. You must present all requirements, including prerequisite courses, to be considered. All applicants are required to present a Senior Year/Grade 12 English course for admission consideration. All programs have limited spaces and selection is competitive. APPLICATION DEADLINES

Submitting a complete application as early as possible allows your application to be considered for a wider range of admission opportunities — and, in many cases, permits earlier decisions.

Student Permit/Visa

If you are not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada, you should apply for a study permit and entry visa (depending on your citizenship) as soon as you receive your letter of admission from the University. You can obtain applications for these documents from a Canadian embassy or consulate before departing.

To obtain a study permit, international students must demonstrate to Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada that they have sufficient resources to cover tuition fees and all living expenses for at least one year. Complete details can be found at **cic.gc.ca**

Centre for International Experience

Adapting to a new cultural environment and a new educational system may present some unexpected challenges. The Centre for International Experience is ready to help you with a wide range of services and programs: **cie.utoronto.ca**

Guardianship

If you are an international student under the age of 18, you may be asked by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada to find a Canadian citizen to act as a guardian. Your family is responsible for satisfying this requirement.

UNIVERSITY TRANSFER APPLICANTS

Applicants interested in transferring from recognized postsecondary institutions, along with current University of Toronto students across all three campuses, must meet the minimum admission requirements for their program. Find requirements for your educational jurisdiction at future.utoronto.ca

Some programs do not consider applications from students who have attended other postsecondary institutions. Be sure the program in which you are interested will consider your application.

Applicants are required to provide transcripts for all secondary and postsecondary level study completed. Admission consideration is based on the overall academic record, with an emphasis on the most recent (or highest) level of study completed, and results in prerequisite subjects.

Applicants who have completed studies beyond the minimum requirements at a recognized postsecondary institution may be granted transfer credits if admitted to a first-entry bachelor's degree program. Transfer credits will be assessed after admission, and after the Transfer Credit Assessment application, if required, has been completed. Details will be provided after an offer of admission is made. Interviews may be required.

Applicants who already hold a bachelor's degree from another postsecondary institution can only apply to a different field of study. For instance, students who have completed a degree in, or have majored in, economics, management, commerce or business, cannot complete our Bachelor of Commerce or Bachelor of Business Administration. If admitted to a different program, these applicants will be granted a maximum of one year of transfer credits (five full credit courses). Applicants who already hold an undergraduate degree in Engineering are not eligible for undergraduate studies at U of T Engineering.

Undergraduate degree holders who wish to take additional undergraduate courses, perhaps in order to qualify for graduate studies, may consider applying for Non-degree studies. Please note that it may not be possible to register as a Non-degree student in courses that are in high demand.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Proof of adequate English facility is required from all applicants except for those:

- whose first language (i.e., the language learned at home as a child) is English; or
- who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in an English language school system located in a country where the dominant language is English; or
- whose first language is French and who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four years of full-time academic study in Canada.

Common English Proficiency Tests/Qualifications

Please note that other English Language Tests/Qualifications are also considered. For a comprehensive list and complete details on our English language proficiency requirements, be sure to visit **uoft.me/elr**

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet-based test: The minimum requirement is a total score of 100 with 22 on the Writing section.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic: The minimum requirement is an overall band of 6.5 with no band lower than 6.0.

Duolingo English Test: The minimum requirement is an overall score of 120.

International Baccalaureate English:

The minimum requirement is Higher Level or Standard Level English A: Literature or English A: Language and Literature with a score of 4 (predicted or final). English B Higher Level is not acceptable.

GCSE/IGCSE/GCE O Level English:

The minimum requirement is English or English Language or English as a Second Language with a final grade of 'B' (or '6' in reformed qualifications).

GCE A/AS Level English:

The minimum requirement is English or English Language with grade of 'C.'

Academic English Course, School of Continuing Studies, University of Toronto:

The minimum requirement is completion of Academic English Level 60 with grade of 'B'. Learn more: **english.learn.utoronto.ca**

International students are permitted to work part-time and may be able to incorporate paid work terms into their academic programs. After you graduate, you may be allowed to live and work in Canada, full-time, for up to three years.

The University of Toronto has a longstanding commitment to promoting access through financial support. Canadian citizens and permanent residents who are living outside Canada are also eligible for the University of Toronto's financial aid support for students in financial need.

Proof of adequate English facility is required from all applicants except for those: whose first language (i.e., the language learned at home as a child) is English; or who have achieved satisfactory results in at

least four years of full-time academic study in an English language school system located in a country where the dominant language is

• whose first language is French and who have achieved satisfactory results in at least four vears of full-time academic study in Canada.

Common English Proficiency Tests/Qualifications

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Internet-based test: The minimum equirement is a total score of 100 with 22 on the Writing section.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS) Academic: The minimum requirement is an overall band of 6.5 with no band lower than 6.0.

Duolingo English Test: The minimum requirement is an overall score of 120.

International Baccalaureate English: The minimum requirement is Higher Level or Standard Level English A: Literature or English A: Language and Literature with a score of 4 (predicted or final). English B Higher Level is not acceptable.

GCSE/IGCSE/GCE O Level English: The minimum requirement is English or

English Language or English as a Second Language with a final grade of 'B' (or '6' in reformed qualifications).

GCE A/AS Level English:

The minimum requirement is English or English Language with grade of 'C.'
